Loss to Garden Community by Richard Porter

At the end of May, we lost a stalwart of the local garden community with the passing of Helen Trueblood. Helen was a former member of DSL, the Daffodil Club and Kentuckiana Hosta Society, and perhaps other garden clubs as well, including LADS.

Many of her garden friends recently joined her to celebrate her 99th birthday in Scottsburg, Indiana. Helen had lived at Leota, Indiana, where she grew several acres of daffodils, Solomon's Seals,

and other woodland plants; Helebores, also known as Lenten Roses, grew around her back steps. Failing health caused her to move to a nursing home shortly before her passing. She could grow anything, and was a valuable member of many groups.

For many years she sponsored the "Mid-West Daffodil Show" in her barn at Leota. Entries came from far and wide to compete. Sometimes, special daffodils were flown in from Ireland or other far places to tantalize the show visitors. And, if you looked hungry or cold after arriving at the barn during the usually cool Spring weather, Helen's Show crew would invite you to have hot coffee, cider and homemade goodies. Such was her hospitality. She often donated daffodil bulbs to help others enjoy the bright, spring flowers in their own gardens. She was such a cheery person, and had a wealth of information about flowers to share. She will be missed by all of us who were fortunate to know her. RIP, Helen.



 height 15 in.(38 cm), bloom 2.75 in.(7 cm), season EM, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Diploid, 10 buds, 2 branches, Double 60%, Dark violet bitone with cream midrib and cream tipped sepals with pronounced veins on the petals and petaloid segments and lime green throat. (Iddy Bidy Gal × Brookwood Black Kitten)



Siding Man (Wolff-D., 2015)
 height 29 in.(74 cm), bloom 4.5 in.(11 cm), season M, Dormant, Diploid, Fragrant, 8 buds, 3 branches, Double 99%, Plum with darker plum eye with pronounced veins and yellow throat. (Double Sanibel Sunrise × Honey Crunch Cupcake)
